

g-MEO Summer Program Session I: Chengdu

June 2nd, 2017 – July 8th, 2017

2017 g-MEO Summer Program Session I will be held at the prestigious **Chengdu American Center for Study Abroad** on the Huaxi campus of **Sichuan University**. A major city with a population of over 14 million, Chengdu recently surpassed Shanghai as the city having the most successful economy in mainland China. It is famous for its world-class Sichuan cuisine, leisurely tea houses, local opera houses, and historic temples, as well as the home of the **giant pandas**. Sichuan University is one of the leading universities in China and the earliest higher education institute in the Sichuan province, dating back to the Qing Dynasty.

School of Record (SOR): Fairleigh Dickinson University (FDU) - one of the most respected regional universities on the East Coast, will serve as the SOR to issue the official transcript for courses offered by the consortium of accredited American universities to students who are duly admitted and have successfully completed one or more for-credit courses on this program. Applicants must obtain the approval of his/her academic advisor from their home institution before he/she can enroll.

Who Should Attend: All college students in the US. g-MEO offers a unique opportunity for both American and international students (including Chinese international students completing college degrees in the US).

Fields of Study: All courses are taught in English by instructors appointed by individual schools that offer those courses with the concurrence of FDU. Students can enroll in 1 to 2 courses during the 5-week program, or up to 3 courses with written authorization of their home institute. Extracurricular Activities and Professional Development: g-MEO staff will organize a number of cultural events and site visits as well as conduct one or more professional development seminars.

Accommodation: Students have the choice to live at the international student dorm on campus or hotel near campus. If you apply before April 15, 2017, the housing fee for a standard double occupancy room is \$470, single occupancy room is \$940. After the deadline, housing fee will be the market price at the time. The housing fee only covers the time from arrival to departure date listed below. Student will be responsible for any extra fees incurred by arriving early or departing late.
